### GENERAL REGULATIONS

ALL candidates will take COM 1010.

ALL candidates will have a minimum grade point average of 2.50 on a 4-point scale.

A 2.50 GPA, with no grade below C, is required on the courses in the teaching field.

A passing score on the Praxis I test and 2.50 GPA must be submitted to the Division of Education before admission to any teacher education program.

A passing score on the appropriate Praxis II test is required for teacher certification.
