All activities shall be conducted within the policies and resource framework of the University, the Athletics Department, the Gulf South Conference, and the NCAA.

### Student-Athlete Development

- Develop student-athletes with counseling, advising, educating, and motivating
- Monitor, evaluate, and retain student-athletes
- Create team building and character development activities with student-athletes

### Coaching

- Instruct and demonstrate different techniques and skills at meetings and practices
- Perform all game-day duties as needed
- Create competition strategies
- Plan daily practices
- Scout opponents including film breakdown and scouting reports

### Recruiting

- Identify and attract prospects to Shorter University
- Evaluate prospects through high school visits, at competitions, etc.
- Recruit Division II eligible prospects from high school, junior college, and transfers.

### Administrative

- Budget management; including equipment, travel, and other team expenses
- Hire, train, and evaluate the performance of assistant coaches
- Abide by the rules and regulations of the NCAA and the Gulf South Conference
- Create and Manage Season Schedule

### Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree and prior coaching experience at the collegiate level required.
- A person guided by Christian principles.
