HEERF II Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students

The recently passed Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act includes a Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) that was set up to provide over \$14 billion in emergency funding to higher education. More than \$6 billion of this funding must go directly to students as emergency financial aid grants for expenses they have incurred relating to the disruption of campus operations due to the COVID-19.

Certification and Agreement Acknowledgement:

Shorter University acknowledges that a signed Certification and Agreement was submitted to the Department of Education on April 9, 2020. This agreement indicated our commitment and assurance that Shorter University would use no less than 50% of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

Funds Received per the HEERF II Grant:

Shorter University applied for and received a total of \$604,040 for the Higher Education Emergency Relief Funds for students grants. The funds were received on January 17, 2021.

Distributed Grants:

As of March 31, 2021 \$604,040.00 of the HEERF II student grants have been distributed to students.

Grants Awarded:

1,098 students were eligible to receive an Emergency Financial Aid Grant received a grant.

Distribution Methodology:

To Determine the distribution method for the HEERF II Grants, priority was given to students that a high need based on their Estimated Family Contribution (EFC). All students received a grant to assist with living expenses and technology.

Checks will be mailed to the address on file and will not be available for pick-up at the Business Office. Please make sure your address is correct or sign up for E-Refund!
